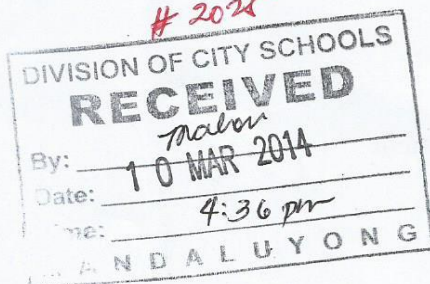

16th IBON National Educators' Seminar-Workshop

To: Schools Division / City Superintendents

1. The IBON Partnership in Education for Development (IPED) will conduct the 16th National Educators' Seminar-Workshop at the Brokenshire Resort in Davao City, on April 22-25, 2014.
2. This year's Seminar-Workshop, with the theme "*Beyond MDGs: Asserting Pro-People Development*" aims to serve as an important platform in building greater awareness and capacity in promoting Human Development Goals that are truly responsive to people's welfare among teachers and school administrators for the benefit of students in elementary and high school. This platform will also involve applying the Seminar-Workshop Theme through different workshops in the spirit of an Education Festival.
3. The expected participants in the Seminar-Workshop are Social Studies teachers and coordinators, and principals or administrators of public and private elementary and secondary schools.
4. Participants coming from partner-schools of IPED shall be given full or partial discounts in joining the Seminar-Workshop. Participants from other schools shall pay the Registration Fee of P5, 000.00 to cover the board and lodging, Seminar-Workshop Kit and Certificates, while a Registration Fee of P2, 500.00 shall be charged for live-out participants. An early bird rate of P4, 500.00 (or P2, 000.00 for live-out participants) can be availed if Confirmation Form is sent on or before February 28, 2014.
5. The transportation costs of participants, including airfare expenses, shall come from the teacher development and other funds of the regional or city office, school and others.
6. Participants coming from public schools shall participate in the Seminar-Workshop within official work-hours only.
7. Because the Seminar-Workshop can only accept a limited number of participants, interested school heads, teachers and coordinators must send their Confirmation Forms on or before **March 28, 2014**.

16th IPED National Educators' Seminar-Workshop
Theme: "Beyond MDGs: Asserting Pro-People Development"

April 22-25, 2014

Brokenshire Resort, Davao City

Rationale:

2014 marks what is expected as the final stretch for countries to fulfill the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). These set of goals were affirmed by member countries of the United Nations in 2000 to help pursue human development by eradicating extreme poverty and hunger, achieve universal primary education, ensure environmental sustainability, promote gender equality, and improve services on the areas of child and maternal health as well as HIV/AIDS, malaria and other illnesses. The MDGs also include the objective of achieving a global partnership for development.

While the MDGs are supposedly reflective of critical areas of human development, the past decade has shown intense economic and social policies that only concentrated resources on a few, while deepening poverty and inequality for the many. And the situation of the Filipino people is a testament not only to the inadequacy of the MDGs itself but to how the most basic progressive reforms that could have been possible are even sidetracked or used to justify pro-business policies.

There is a need therefore to reassert our right to development by focusing on development goals that genuinely address our welfare while sustaining the environment. The recent man-made and natural calamities that rocked the Philippines show us how policies have basically failed in securing human welfare.

And Filipino educators have an important role, being in the forefront of training the next set of leaders, of helping spread information on alternative and progressive policies and measures that provide a clearer path to human development.

Seminar-Workshop Objective:

The 16th IPED National Educators' Seminar-Workshop seeks to be an important platform in building greater awareness and capacity in promoting Human Development Goals that are truly responsive to people's welfare among teachers and school administrators for the benefit of students in elementary and high school. This platform will also involve applying the Seminar-Workshop Theme through different workshops in the spirit of an Education Festival.

Specific Objectives:

1. Re-examine the Millennium Development Goals, especially in the Philippine context, towards highlighting progressive measures and policies that truly respond to people's welfare, particularly in the areas of environment/disaster risk reduction, education and other social services, national economy, peace efforts and governance.
2. Develop modules that contain teaching strategies and methods on how to integrate Human Development Goals in the existing Curriculum.
3. Link Seminar-Workshop participants with people's organizations and ongoing people's campaigns through the Education Forum for Development (Efd).

Premier region: none of world-class university curriculum
