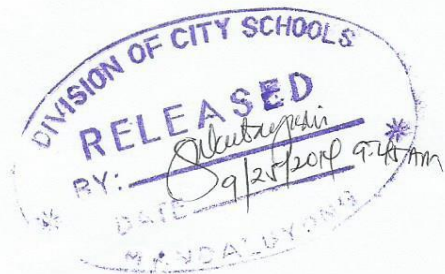

It is a pleasure to write you on behalf of Parent Advocates for Visually Impaired Children (PAVIC), a parent support group advocating for the welfare of our children with visual impairment. Over the years, PAVIC has evolved into a formal organization making tremendous strides in the education of our children and raising awareness about the great ways that children with disabilities can participate in society. Throughout our activities we strive to advance the welfare of all children and explore educational opportunities that empower them as active agents in their individual, family and community lives.

On September 26-27, 2014, PAVIC will hold a two day Therapy Orientation seminar on "Parents and Teachers Education on Re/Habilitation of Children with Multiple Disabilities and Visual Impairment (MDVI). In line with this, we wish to invite SPED teachers handling children with MDVI only to attend the said activity. A letter from your office encouraging school administrators to allow the parents and SPED teachers of MDVI to this activity will be of great help. We're inviting therapists from UP-CAMP and UST College of Rehabilitation Sciences as our resource speakers. On the 2<sup>nd</sup> day, the therapists will be screening and giving home programs to children with MDVI.

There is a minimum registration of P500 for teachers to cover for their food and kit. FREE registration for parents.
